1. Acknowledgement of Country

An Acknowledgement of Country was spoken by the Chair, Alicia, in recognition of the traditional owners of the land on which the meeting was taking place.

2. Welcome and confirmation of minutes held 29th March 2022

The Chair, Alicia, welcomed members to the meeting, noting that Shannon had given prior apologies to the meeting. Minutes of last meeting were confirmed by Connor Scott.

3. Business arising from previous meeting

In the first meeting Connor offered to make contact with members of the Research Student Social Committee (RSSC). Both Timothy and Connor attempted to contact them via email with no success. Samuel confirmed that he was aware of who was currently running the RSSC. Contact will be made at the next social mixer to begin more collaboration with RSSC and RSAG committee. This will be confirmed for the next meeting.

4. Research Student Social Committee report

As there was no contact able to be made the report from the RSSC will be delayed until the next meeting of the RSAG committee.

Reports from the RSAG representatives on the SCMB Research Committee and the SCMB Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Committee (EDIC) and HDR representative for Student Leaders forum

As representative of the RSAG committee Athyah provided an update from the recent meeting of the EDIC committee. Two major points were discussed. First the need to engage more with indigenous staff and students. The idea of creating more scholarships was suggested. Secondly, the need to create measures to cater for individuals with physical disabilities was also discussed.

The RSAG committee then discussed potential measures such as specialised labs to cater for reaching higher objects and shelves, limited wheelchair access around the school, and increased safety within laboratories for individuals with hearing impairments. Alicia enquired about what

committee was involved with lab space and accessibility to which Luke responded that it was the space and facility committee who were in charge of that. Athyah suggested that if we knew anyone who had a physical disability working in science that they should contact Aythya or the RSAG committee to provide more feedback on what they see necessary.

Forhad provided a brief update on the SCMB Research Committee. Due to prior commitments and short notice of the meeting Forhad was only able to attend the meeting briefly and will provide a more extensive update after the next meeting.

6. Seminar opportunity for HDR students associated with the Structural Biology and Biochemistry (SBB) theme and Queensland Annual Chemistry Symposium (QACS) call for volunteers

7. Annual SCMB Research Students Symposium

- Access of or requesting assistance to access share drive was confirmed for all members present
- The committee agreed that the share drive would be the best location to provide updates on progress of each assigned jobs.
- Options for the best method of communication outside of meetings were then discussed with three options put forward: 1) Slack 2) Microsoft teams and 3) Whatsapp
- A vote was taken with the majority of members present voting for Slack.
